OMLA Fellowship Program

The OMLA mandate is a bold one that requires lots of efforts to see it come to fruition. Call for the OMLA fellowship application was made in October and over 100 young people across about 20 African countries applied. 23 young visionaries were finally shortlisted after undergoing series of screening exercises by some of OMLA founding members and advisory board members. In December the 20th, the 23 young people shortlisted as the OMLA Fellows were inaugurated as pioneer fellows into the OMLA fellowship pilot phase. The inauguration ceremony was wrapped up with an inspiring African song and the spirit of a united Africa was aroused in everyone. The fellowship will kickstart by January 2022 with a 2-month virtual training for the fellows and the recruiting of the OMLA Stars. It will also be followed by the OMLA stars onsite training by the trained fellows for 3 months.

Afterward, the OMLA stars and fellows will be subjected to the task of identifying social problems in their various communities (with other young people they come across during the course of the project, called Starlets), and work on them. Mini-grants would be awarded to execute all social projects after they've been properly vetted by the secretariat. At the end of their fellowship, OMLA Fellows, Stars, and Starlets that successfully complete the fellowship program shall all be welcomed to a vibrant and life-long OMLA Alumni community that is privy to several life-transforming opportunities. Fundraising

To support our activities, we participated in the GlobalGiving Accelerator Crowdfunding Campaign where we raised more than \$5,000 which was the general funding goal and became qualified to be a permanent partner of the fundraising platform. Right now, we have raised \$12,287 through the platform to support the pilot year of the OMLA Fellowship program. However, we still have a long way to go in getting funds because the funds we have raised so far does not amount up to a quarter of the total budget to run the fellowship pilot year; and one of the major factors that determine the success of the OMLA Fellowship is the availability of funds. To enhance fundraising, we are currently working on creating a fundraising team, which will be led by Lina Khaznadar, a member of the Advisory board of OMLA.

The purpose of this team will be to make research on charity organizations and other organizations that fund projects like OMLA and apply for available grants and other fund allocations. Also, the team is working on creating a business model which will help fund the project sustainably.
