OMLA FELLOWSHIP

This year, we were overwhelmed by the response to our fellowship, receiving over 15,000 applications from 40 African countries. In April, we proudly inaugurated 200 young and passionate individuals as Fellows.

A significant milestone was reached as I4O Fellows embarked on the 5 OML Pillars training, marking the beginning of their leadership journey. These Fellows, in turn, identified and mentored 4,000 young and passionate individuals as OMLA Champions within their communities.

The third phase of the fellowship, "Act for Change," saw Fellows and Champions collaborate to identify pressing social issues within their communities. 82 project proposals were submitted, and 22 were selected for funding and implementation.

OMLA CLUB AND BOOT CAMP















The year kicked off with the much-awaited launch of the OMLA Club, welcoming over 300 enthusiastic students from last year's school boot camp. Armed with a comprehensive manual, club members are eager to unlock their leadership abilities and become agents of positive impact. The OMLA Club initiative continued to thrive, with a growing membership of over 300 active participants. The second edition of the One Million Leaders Africa (OMLA) Bootcamp 2024, held at St. Louis Grammar School in Akure, Nigeria, empowered 120 young minds aged 13-18. This transformative week-long experience focused on leadership, sustainability, entrepreneurship, and climate change. The boot camp, part of a larger movement to inspire a million young leaders by 2030, provided participants of this year's edition with practical skills and knowledge. They learned about climate change mitigation, leadership techniques, career paths, technology, and entrepreneurship. Through hands-on workshops, they gained experience in metalworking, food processing, and tree planting. The event culminated in a grand finale, showcasing the participants' achievements, including their entrepreneurial projects and essay competition winners. OMLA 2024 has set a strong foundation for future initiatives, demonstrating the immense potential of Africa's youth.




